I am writing to confirm that the Durham Valley Scenic Byway within the Town of Durham, in Greene County is a designated New York State Scenic Byway. The designated scenic byway has a length of 21 miles, all within the Town limits.

The Durham Valley Scenic Byway Corridor Management Plan (CMP) has been presented to and accepted by New York State Scenic Byways Program staff on behalf of the New York State Scenic Byways Advisory Board. As a designated New York State Scenic Byway, with an accepted CMP, the byway management entity for this byway is potentially eligible to seek future funding opportunities as they arise and become available.

Additionally, each of the byway segments that traverse the Durham Valley were originally designated as a Scenic Road by the New York State Department of Environmental Conservation's Scenic Roads Program in 1991, and are therefore, designated and legislated as components of the New York State Scenic Byways Program by New York State Highway Law, Section 349-DD, Components: *(k) "highways designated as scenic roads pursuant to article forty-nine of the Environmental Conservation Law"*.
